American Society of Ichthyology and Herpetology Annual Meeting, Victoria, B.C. Canada, June 15 to 21, 1986

The British Columbia Provincial Museum, in Victoria and the University of Victoria will cohost the annual meeting of the American Society of Ichthyology and Herpetology, June 15–21, 1986. The opening session will be held at the museum, but housing and all following sessions will be at the University of Victoria. There will be a symposium on the systematics and biology of deep-sea fishes, as well as symposia on snake behaviour and ecology, and physiology and ecology of ectotherm hibernation.

Direct airflights are available from Tokyo to either Seattle, U.S.A. or Vancouver, Canada on the North American west coast, and commuter aircraft or buses and ferries can transport delegates the short 100 km distance to Victoria. The world fair "Expo. 86" is expected to increase the number of tourists, consequently delegates to the meeting are urged to reserve transport and lodgings early.
